

Jungian Psychotherapists Association (JPA)

Statement of Purpose

The JPA is an organization of professionally diverse psychotherapists with similar commitments to and interests in Analytic Psychology. The JPA provides a structured forum in which professional (i.e., licensed or certified) psychotherapists pool resources to obtain professional education and training, in addition to local educational organizations. JPA creates a context in which members are supported by others with similar experience and training.

Programs

JPA programs include

Business meetings: an annual JPA meeting, quarterly council meetings, and an annual council retreat.

Educational programs: an annual ethics workshop; a public event for the professional community; two clinical workshops led by distinguished presenters, usually Jungian analysts; two-hour Case Consultation groups with workshop presenters. Study groups, consultation groups and social events occur throughout the year.

Members receive reduced fees at all events. Members may invite licensed/certified guests to clinical workshops.

Past presenters include Beverly Zabriski, Mario Jacoby, John Beebe, Thomas Kirsh, Ladson Hinton, Michael Conforti, Polly Young-Eisendrath, Tony Frey, Donald Kalshed, Sylvia Perera, and Allan Chinen.

Membership Requirements

The JPA offers three categories of membership:

Full

- practicing psychotherapists with a graduate degree in a mental health discipline;
- certified/licensed in home state/province; &
- completed at least 100 hours of personal analysis with a Jungian Analyst who is a member of the International Association of Analytical Psychology (IAAP).

Associate

- practicing psychotherapists with a graduate degree in a mental health discipline;
- registered, certified or licensed in home state or province; &
- completed at least 25 hours of personal analysis with a Jungian Analyst who is a member of the IAAP.

To continue toward full membership, associate members must meet requirements for full membership (certified/licensed; 100 hours of analysis with a Jungian Analyst who is a member of the IAAP) within two years of joining the JPA.

Benefactor

- practicing psychotherapists with a graduate degree in a health discipline; &
- certified/licensed in home state/province.

Programs/meetings included in Benefactor dues: ethics workshop; business meetings. Benefactor members pay guest fee for clinical workshops and for the annual public event. Benefactor members do not have voting rights or responsibilities.
